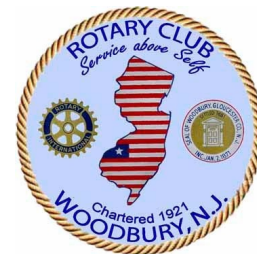

WHAT IS RYLA?

Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA) is a leadership development program run by Rotary. Our District focuses on high school juniors entering their senior year in September. RYLA conference is 5 days/4 nights long at the Stockton University, and includes presentations, activities, and workshops that cover a variety of topics, including:

1. Leadership fundamentals and ethics
2. Communication skills
3. Problem solving and conflict management
4. Community and global citizenship

HOW CAN I PARTICIPATE IN RYLA?

Follow RYLA on Facebook to learn about inspirational events happening around the globe. Each year our Rotary Clubs interview eligible students to participate in our RYLA Program. Applications will be available on the web site every year in February.

History of RYLA

In 1959, the state government of Queensland, Australia, invited local Rotary Clubs to help plan an event to help celebrate the upcoming centennial of the state. Princess Alexandra, who was in her early 20s was due to attend the celebrations, so activities were planned specifically for the princess's age group.

The Gundoo, an aboriginal word meaning "festival" or "fun together," was deemed successful with more than 300 men and women between the ages of 17 and 23 attending. Encouraged by the event's popularity with the young attendees, Rotary saw potential to create an annual youth program based on Gundoo. The governor of the then District 260, Art Brand, approved the project and on 2 May 1960, RYLA was an official Rotary project.

Australian districts 258 and 260 established a committee together that developed the official framework of RYLA: to train youth ages 14-30 in character, leadership, personal development, and good citizenship.

These guidelines helped RYLA expand to all Rotary districts in Australia and led to its approval as a Rotary International program by the RI Board at the 1971 Convention in Sydney, Australia.

30 Years Woman in Rotary

Judy Baillere's call to action is very personal. Growing up there were four roles to which a woman could aspire: wife, teacher, nurse and secretary. A Home Economics major, she taught grades 7-12 in Atco, NJ. When Gloucester County needed a 4H agent, to train volunteer leaders and teach life skills to children, she jumped at the chance. Her roles changed, but the goal was the same, to teach children the practical side of life. Her focus was mentoring young girls and preparing them for college.

Her passion for mentoring and higher education led her to join AAUW in 2001, where she could actively work to grow programs offering support and scholarships for young women. She is now focused on the AAUW STEM program, which includes a summer science camp program. She also serves on the Women's Council of the

United Way, which evaluates applicants and allocates funding for programs which benefit women and girls. Judy has been an active member of the Rotary Club of Mullica Hill since 2005. Her first hands on projects were a bike collection and sewing program. The Bike project received bicycles picked up by the police, refurbished them and distributed them to third world countries. The sewing project collected and refurbished sewing machines which were distributed in third world countries to women starting cottage industries. These businesses stabilize and improve the lives of families - and their entire communities.

Judy's lifetime of service above self through Rotary, United Way, AAUW, the Mullica Hill Historical Society, and local food pantries is a constant inspiration.
