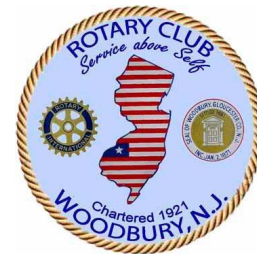

Have you or anyone you know ever stepped on a landmine? Probably not – aren't we fortunate! If you live in Cambodia, Iraq or Syria, however, you may not have been so lucky.

Rotarians have committed time and money to eliminate many ills that plague our world, including longstanding support of landmine eradication. We at the Canadian Landmine Foundation (CLMF) are asking Rotarians to renew their commitment to eliminating these hideous devices.

Landmine use is on the rise and funding has steadily declined over the past number of years. Overall funding for landmine relief is at its lowest point in 10 years.

Yet many are still suffering.

As many as 18 people, mostly children and women, lose their lives or limbs each day to the catastrophic effects of landmines. The conflicts that led to these landmines may have been over for decades, but the suffering continues. It is time for Rotarians to revisit their commitment to this worthwhile cause. In keeping with this year's Rotary theme – it is time once again for Rotarians to make a difference.

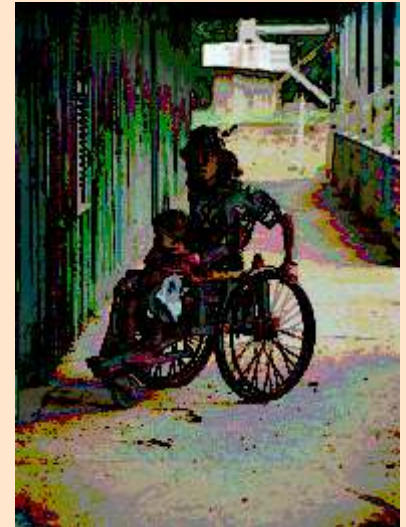
We are asking clubs and Districts to strongly consider supporting our organization, which has substantial and active Rotary representation. How can you help?
