Polio Immunization Campaigns

National Immunization Days involve:

- 2.3 million vaccinators
- 209 million houses visited
- 155,000 supervisors
- 172 million children under the age of five vaccinated

On average, Sub-National Immunization Days involve:

 70 million+ children vaccinated in the highest-risk areas



National Immunization Days

National Immunization Days (NIDs) are held across India twice a year, with the Government of India setting out to give two drops of oral polio vaccine (OPV) to every child in the country under the age of five. The scale is extraordinary, with more than 172 million children immunized by 2.3 million vaccinators who visit every house in every city, town and village across the country – more than 209 million houses in all.

Sub-National Immunization Days


Several Sub-National Immunization Days (SNIDs) are also held annually in the highest-risk states, including Uttar Pradesh, Bihar, West Bengal and areas most at risk of a polio outbreak, due to underlying factors such as poor sanitation, high population density, a high enteric disease burden, a general lack of services and low rates of routine immunization. On average, more than 70 million children are vaccinated in each SNID.

Booth Day

In the states of Uttar Pradesh and West Bengal, polio campaigns are launched with 'Booth Day' on 'Polio Sunday', where thousands of fixed site booths are set up throughout the neighbourhood for children to be brought to receive OPV. Once vaccinated, each child has the little finger on their left hand marked with a permanent marker and in many locations are also given a nutritional supplement, a paper sun-visor or mask, a ball and a whistle. In UP, a children's brigade called the 'Bulawa Toli' (or 'Calling Troupe') parades through the neighbourhood waving flags, blowing whistles and calling out polio vaccination slogans, inviting younger children to the booth to receive OPV.

Visiting Every House

From Monday to Thursday, vaccination teams go door to door to every house, checking each child under five to see if their left little finger is marked, and if not, vaccinating them with OPV. If a child is not home, or a parent refuses vaccination, the outside of the house is marked with an X, and recorded in a register, for the 'B' team to return to that afternoon. If the 'B' team is also unsuccessful in reaching the child, a third team visits at the conclusion of the round to attempt to sweep up any missed children.



Eleven of the thirteen colonies organized a state navy, but it was the Pennsylvania Navy that distinguished itself in battle.

Fearing for the safety of Philadelphia and the Continental Congress, Pennsylvania, in June of 1775, authorized a defense of the Delaware River by forts, underwater obstructions, and armed vessels. Accordingly, a fleet was built or purchased consisting of the flagship Montgomery, a frigate carrying fourteen eighteen-pounders, the schooner Delaware, the brig Convention, thirteen row galleys, two floating batteries, numerous fire ships and fire rafts, and twenty-one small craft known as guard boats. In support of the state navy were several ships under Continental command.

When, on September 26, 1777, the British occupied Philadelphia, General Sir William Howe faced the absolute necessity of clearing the Delaware River so that his army could be supplied by water. Promptly, General Howe seized the fort at Billingsport, New Jersey, while Admiral Lord Richard Howe began the operation of removing a line of underwater obstructions which crossed the river near the fort. In the days that followed, Fort Mercer at


Red Bank, New Jersey, gallantly repulsed a determined Hessian attack, two British warships ran aground and were destroyed, and Fort Mifflin on Mud Island just below the mouth of the Schuylkill River was completely demolished by cannon fire in one of the most heroic defenses of the American Revolution.

Under the command of Commodore John Hazelwood the Pennsylvania Navy, hopelessly outclassed by the British fleet, did what it could and all but one of the thirteen row galleys were badly damaged. On November 20, the row galleys passed up the river to Bristol but, the wind failing, all sailing vessels were set on fire and abandoned. Thereafter, British ships from New York could supply the British army

After the British evacuated Philadelphia in June of 1778, there was little for the Pennsylvania Navy to do and by 1780 only twenty-one officers and men remained on duty. In 1781 this force was reduced to one captain and three invalided seamen. By the end of the year even these were discharged. The Pennsylvania Navy was then represented only by the unfortunate prisoners held in the foul British prison ships anchored in New York harbor.
