# Cherry Hill Collected Books for U.S. Troops in Vietnam

The Rotary Club of Cherry Hill was chartered Feb. 3, 1955 as the Erlton Rotary Club because there was no Cherry Hill at the time, and Erlton was the local post office. The sponsoring club was Collingswood Rotary. Since its start 35 years ago, Cherry Hill in turn has co-sponsored the Mt. Laurel club as well as sponsored its neighboring Garden State Rotary Club of Cherry Hill.

The Cherry Hill Club has immersed itself deeply in activities to benefit its community.

In 1965, for example, Cherry Hill Rotarians collected more than 5,000 hard cover and paperback books to be sent to American troops stationed in the Saigon area of Vietnam. Dr. Ralph A. Skowron, a Rotarian who was a major and chief flight surgeon for the Delaware Air Guard, took it upon himself to personally fly the books to Vietnam.

On a rainy Saturday in 1966, Cherry Hill members planted 48 Chinese Scholar trees at the front entrance of the new Cherry Hill Library on Kings Highway in Cherry Hill. A quarter century later, the trees remain a beautiful enhancement to the library as well as a lasting monument to Cherry Hill Rotary.

On Christmas morning, it is a club tradition for members and their families to take time from their own festive days to visit St. Mary's Nursing Home in Cherry Hill. They bring holiday joy to the residents, many of whom have no families of their own. The Rotarians give poinsettias and Christmas cards to the residents and sing Christmas carols in the halls.

Among the numerous other Cherry Hill Rotary projects are these:

The club provided raincoats for local school safety guards.

It presented flags to schools that were certified to have flown over the Capitol in Washington\_

It was instrumental in getting the Delaware Township Little League recognized in Cooperstown, N.Y.'s

Baseball Hall of Fame when a local pitcher tossed a no-hitter in post-season championship play,

It constructed a foot bridge at Pine Hill Boy Scouts Camp.

Since 1982, it has awarded on an annual basis college scholarships to high school students who best exemplify the ideals of Rotary International.
