

Pine Hill Aid to Handicapped, Needy Among Club Projects

Throughout the brief history of Pine Hill-Clementon-Erial Rotary, the club emphasis has been overwhelming in living up to the Rotary International credo of "Service Above Self." And no example more dramatically underscores Pine Hill-Clementon-Erial's belief in unselfish service than its commitment to the flood-ravaged area of Wilkes-Barre, Pa. when several Rotarians, under the leadership of Doti Cianci, took time from their jobs and their own families to assist some of the thousands of victims rendered homeless.

Sponsored by neighboring Blackwood Rotary, Pine Hill-Cleiiienton-Efial was chartered Dec. 27, 1966 and held its charter night the following Jan. 24. Dr. Bernie Blaum was the Governor's Representative from the Blackwood club during the tenure of District Governor C. William Haines Sr., a Moorestown Rotarian.

Joseph G. Huber was elected the club's charter president, heading a cabinet which consisted of William H. Rehrer, Jr., vice president; Thomas Murphy, secretary; Dominic Ciansi, treasurer; Charles (Bud) Carr, sergeant-atarms; and Alonso Hosford, Oreste Mogavero, Joseph B. Lanieri and Terry Scheible, directors. Mogavero

During its 24 years, Pine Hill-Clementon-Erial has participated in countless worthwhile community projects such as Christmas baskets for the underprivileged; a new roof for the Pine Hill Youth Center; and the purchase of a hearing aid for a learning impaired six-year-old boy.

One of the club's most meaningful projects was the raising of funds to provide medical treatment for a 25-yearold who fractured his neck. The Rotarians pitched in to build a one-room addition to the man's house because he needed a larger room to accommodate all of his medical equipment.

Pine Hill-Clementon-Erial also has been an enthusiastic supporter of the Rotary Youth Exchange Program. As, just one example, the club sent a female student to Australia to study for a year.
