

### Deptford Rotary's Civic Activities Peak During the Holidays

Through the organizational efforts of long-time Woodbury Rotarian Walt Fish, Deptford Rotary was chartered in April 1969 with Edward Boschetti serving as the first president. Deptford has earned a reputation as one of the most active clubs in District 764 as well as one of the most fun-loving.

Deptford's civic endeavors are widely known, particularly during the holiday season.

For many years, Deptford Rotary has held a highly successful gala Christmas party for the elderly at Cedars Rest Home, then also a cookout with a string band for the same folks during the summer.

In recent years, Deptford has gone all out at Christmas. This past Christmas the club took \$3,000 from its treasury - the funds from a variety of fund-raising events to provide a happy holiday for eight needy families in Deptford and Mantua townships. One of the club's chief money-makers is its annual solicitation from area businesses in the spring.

Also at Christmas, the club raises as much as \$16,000 at a local K-Mart store through an angel tree to provide gifts for underprivileged youngsters in the Gloucester County area.

Between its two holiday events, Deptford Rotary provided about \$20,000 in gifts for Christmas 1989.

"It just makes you feel fantastic," says 1989-90 Deptford President Ted Bamford, who started the angel tree. George Nicholson started the other Christmas project during his year as president in 1988-89.

But the Christmas parties represent just a small part of Deptford's community involvement over the years.

One of the club's first successful undertakings was raising, about \$650 for an upright piano which was donated to John of God School for the Mentally Retarded in Westville Grove.

Here are just a few of the other activities:

--Charter members John Deehan and Paul Damiani chaired the club's first fund-raiser, a golf outing at Tall Pines (now Ron

Jaworski's Eagles' Nest} in 1970. A sign of the times: The entry fee was just \$8. The golf tournament became one of the club's primary fund-raisers.

--A club-sponsored horse show was held for five years during the early '80s and raised more than \$10,000. That event eventually was replaced by a dog show for one year.

--An art auction, started in the early '80s, has become one of the club's top events. It has raised about \$21,000 to date.

--Other endeavors have included a Bike-A-Rama; Junior Miss Deptford Pageant; repairing homes of the needy; honoring of Spartans of the Month from Deptford High and Gators of the Month from Gateway High; float participation in Deptford Day; support of PolioPlus and the orphanage in the Dominican Republic; sponsorship of St. John of God students in the Special Olympics; providing of playground equipment for the handicapped at Deptford's Fasola Park; bicycle safety program; two wheelchairs for Underwood-Memorial Hospital; three power motorized wheelchairs for needy individuals; a kidney dialysis machine to U-M hospital; furnishing of a room at Underwood; heavy participation in the district Phillies' game through distribution of numerous tickets; and sending four students to RYLA each summer.

Largely through the organizational efforts of Pete Butler, Deptford was the sponsoring club for West Deptford Rotary.

The club boasts an unusually large number of Paul Harris Fellows: 34 in just 20 years. Most others are sustaining members, and 1989-90 president Ted Bamford's goal is 100 percent participation during his year.

Charter members still active are John Bill, Pete Butler, Don MacKerell, Paul Damiani and Walt Keane.

Deptford Rotary's hospitality room at the district conference traditionally has been one of the most unusual ones. For example, for several years the club brought in a roasted pig, complete with apple in its mouth, and toasted the event with champagne.

The club's gift to its guest speakers through the years, appropriately, has been a pig statue -- symbolic of the township's pig farms. The trophies have been well received and much talked about at Rotary International headquarters.

Deptford Rotary also has one of the most active Rotaryanns groups in the district. In recent years they have raised as much as \$4,000 annually to donate to needy groups. Also, they organize and run the hospitality room at the convention and actively work in every project the club undertakes. A few in the group aren't even wives of Rotarians.
